






















LAURA AGUSTÍ




























BRIANDA FIZT-JAMES STUART




























AGUSTINA GUERRERO


























MARÍA HESSE


























REBECA KHAMLICHI

REBECA KHAMLICHI (Madrid, 1987) is a painter, illustrator, and writer. In her universe, graphic design, 17th-century religious iconography, cartoons, Spanish folk music (copla), and Goya's Black Paintings jostle for space. Her first graphic novel, The Daughters of Antonio López, was unanimously praised by critics. In it, she reflects on her childhood and that of her sister, set in a hostile family environment where religious fanaticism, neglect, and addiction create a scene full of ghosts. A setting where innocence and reality intertwine, portrayed in a delicate, emotional way—worthy of admiration and profoundly healing. She has a greyhound with a human name, a cat with a fruit name, and a house named after a means of transportation. She paints in Madrid on a terrace overlooking the rooftops of the Lavapiés neighborhood. And she does it, she says, because—for now—acrylic paints are dispensed without a prescription.






























LYONA












































XIMENA MAIER











































IRENE MALA
